
We have received your letter of June 14, 1957, in which you send us your suggestions for your lectures.

1. Os Diretores do Centro Brasileiro de Pesquisas Educacionais, Drs. Anísio S. Teixeira e Péricles Madureira de Pinho, tendo em vista a troca de correspondência mantida pelos Drs. Robert J. Havighurst e J. Roberto Moreira - diretores de estudos e pesquisas do Centro - com o Dr. George S. Counts, professor emérito da "Columbia University" de Nova Iorque, no sentido de trazê-lo ao Brasil para uma série de conferências sobre filosofia da educação, resolveram aprovar a dita correspondência, determinando que, para o mencionado fim, fôsse elaborado o presente projeto.
2. O Dr. George S. Counts, cujos trabalhos sempre tiveram repercussão mundial, notabilizando-se pela interpretação e apreciação dos problemas e das realizações educacionais dos Estados Unidos e de outros países, deverá realizar 4 conferências no Rio de Janeiro, em São Paulo, Bahia, Pôrto Alegre e Belo Horizonte, nas quais procurará resumir as linhas mestras do seu pensamento e da sua experiência educacionais.

Dear Prof. Counts.

It is a pleasure to know that you have accepted our invitation to visit Brazil as a lecturer and adviser in Education.

We have been thinking that perhaps it will be possible for you to write three lectures on the education as the problem of man. Would it not be interesting if you could take your "Dare the schools build a new social order?" and rewrite the same hypothesis in the light of society to-day?

It should not be education before the soviet challenge but education before the fear (or defensive spirit) challenge, education before the science challenge, and education before the "organization" challenge.

If we could find a way to go back to the fundamental and candid faith in man of the American Fathers, despite everything that has happened, is happening and, perhaps, will happen, this will be something like rediscovering the human path!...

Excuse me for my ambitious phrasing of it but something along these ideas would be quite inspiring for a nation which is on her way to development in such unsettled conditions as is our Brazil.

Professors Havighurst and Roberto Moreira will give you the details about your visit and will be glad to answer any further questions you may have.
