red to in your letter had already been brought to our attention, through an exchange of news and ideas between Snr. Affonso de Silva, from the UNESCO, Prof. Anisio Teixeira, and myself.

I attach herewith our previous discussions, with the thought that you might be interested in them.

I attack also three papers written by me relative to the subject of the forthcoming Conference. In one of them (Research and Planning in Education) together with a basic conceptual summary, there is a report on the situation of educational research in Brazil.

If you were interested in having them translated into English, they might possibly be used as material for the forthcoming Conference, especially the one entitled "Research and Planning in Education". We have been reading the agenda of the Conference and getting acquainted with the attendance requirements. Since all travel and living expenses will be the responsibility of participants, we still have to study the mossibility of translation presents.

In any case, we can tell vou that Brazil will be represented by a special report, and we have the greatest interest in the work and conclusions of the Conference. After reading the Agenda, I find that there has been a change, or better, an addition to the subjects that were expected at first, based on the information received from Mr. Affonso de Silva (UNESCO). It will not only be a Conference on

Educational Research, but it will also approach such subjects as Comparative Education, Educational Policy, Educational Sociology.

We are of the opinion that, as far as "educational research" is concerned, the subject as presented might have been more specific.

A'so, comparative criticisms might be difficult in view of the different ways in which educational research is understood and practiced.

We presented these considerations after learning of the subject and when Snr. Affonso de Silva (UNESCO) requested us to criticize it.

In any case, we await your further news, upon which time we shall give the Conference our utmost support and cooperation.

Trate-se de decisão sobre o último documento (anexado) que nos chega as mãos, relacionado com a realização da "Internacional Conference on Educational Research" á se efetuer em Toxyo, Japão, de 31 de agosto a 8 de setembro, proximos, sob os auspicios da "The Japan Society for the Study of Education".

O assunto chegou, preliminermente, até nos, mediante correspondência do Sr. Alfonso de Silva da UNESCO (Education Clearing House) endereçada ao Professor Anísic S. Teixeira, sugerindo a elaboração de um número especial de "Educação e Ciencias Sociais", dedicado a pesquisa educacional, como documento a ser eventualmente utilizado na preparação dessa conferencia no Japão.

A proposta foi examinada pelos Professores Anísio Teixeira e Robert Havighurst e respondida em carta do Prof. Anísio Teixeira de 30 de junho de 1958, na qual o seu autor expoe o seu ponto de vista a respeito, que era também o do Prof. Robert Havighurst, sugerindo orientação a respeito, diferente dequela apresentada pelo Sr. Alfonso de Silva, para "vitalizar" a reunião.

Houve, depois, correspondência de nossa autoria com o Sr. Alfonso de Silva (cartas de 16 de julho e 8 de setembro) e resposta do mesmo (carta de 19 de setembro, 1958).

Nessa carta o Senhor Alfonso de Silva anuncia va que incorporara as sugestões do Prof. Anisio Teixeira e nossas a formulação de novo "outline" a respeito, que nos se ria enviado em outubro, o que não ocorreu, até agora.

Depois veio ter-nos as mãos o documento de 10 de dezembro de 1958 do "Office of the International Conference on Educational Research", capeando documentos com a agenda dos trabalhos previstos e condições de realização da conferencia.

A 15 de janeiro de 1959 respondíamos ao Prof. To iomi Kaigo, "President Japan Society for the Study of Education" tecendo considerações a respeito da agenda e das condições de realização da conferencia.

Recebemos resposta do mesmo a 21 de fevereiro anuindo as observações que transmitimos do rof. Anisio Teixeira e nossas é insistindo não apenas no recebimento de contribuição de estudo brasileiro mas na presença de educador brasileiro a reunião.

Depois disso estamos recebendo carta de 8 de junho, do Sr. Morihiko Okatsu, Secretario Geral da Conferencia, consultando se possível uma presença brasileira ou com que especie de cooperação brasileira poderiam contar.

A conferência versa de fato um temério particularmente interessante para um Centro de Pesquisas Educa - cionais.

As condições oferecidas aos participantes, to davia, apenas lhes ensejam "a small contribution to them, which can almost cover the expenses for their lodging. But it feels very sorry that the high expenses of their travelaling is still beyond its power".

Considerando assim as "high expenses" do Governo brasileiro para uma participação pessoal de educador na Conferencia, submeto a consideração do Sr. Diretor-Geral, como forma de contribuição brasileira:

- a) traduzir para o inglês e enviar à Confe rência, nosso trabalho sobre "Pesquisa e Planejamento em Educação", onde so lado de uma introdução teórica, há um ba lanço da situação da pesquisa educacional no Brasil;
 - b) enviar êsse trabalho à Conferência;
- ma, dando ciência dessa decisão;
- d) fazer-se representar o Brasil na mesma por integrante de sua Embaixada em Tokyo, Japão.

Dear Mr. de Silva,

We refer to your correspondence with our Director, Prof. Anisio Teixeira, who sent it on to me in view of my posi - tion as Assessor-Coordinator of the Division of Educational Studies and Researches of the Brazilian Center of Educational Resear-

ch, of INEP.

Upon my return from the United States where I represented Brazil in the Inter-merican Seminary of Integral Educational Planning, organized by the Organization of American States with the cooperation of UNESCO, I could re-examine the subject "Educational Research", main theme of your correspondence with Prof. Anisio Teixeira, and which is, in Brazil, the field of my professional activity in education.

Generally speaking, we are all in agreement with Prof. Anisio Teixeira's thinking, with relation to the measures to be taken in order to keep the Tokyo Conference away from generalizations and from the dangerous illness known as "diffuseness".

This does not mean, however, that in the case of a subject like educational research, in its initial stages of approach, there should not be a certain concern with a discussion and revision of its theoretical structure. This was the stand taken by the specialists in Atlantic City, in Feb. 1956, during the 1st International Conference of Educational Research, when Brazil was represented by Br. Anisio Teixeira. At that time the following recommendation was approved: "to raise the level of educational research and to revise its theoretical structure in order to increase its efficiency".

There is no doubt that an International Seminary would be a good occasion to examine the subject of the discussion and revision of the theoretical structure of educational research, side by side with other specific subjects, all them placed under the responsibility of competent and experienced professionals.

We take the liberty of suggesting two subjects be added to the thirteen inclided in your list. These two subjects, together with several others, are of very relevant pratical importance in the funcioning of educational systems.

1. Research on the procedures and criteria adopted in financing education. Priorities and considered factors. Retionalization of investments and expenses.

2. Research on the processes of promotion used in the middle school, secondary school and second degree.

The former is a more general subject, but of definite importance with relation to the whole educational system; the latter is a more limited subject, but of utmost value.

To show our interest in the subject under discussions we take the liberty on sending you, for your own guidance, two papers which might be useful in the proposal of a basic scheme of references to educational research, as well as the recommendations formulated by us and unanimously approved during the Interamerican Seminary of Integral Planning of Education, on the theme "Role of the Research Centers in Educational Planning", for which we were responsible. To make up these recommendations we used our study on "Research and Planning in Education", which we are sending herewith, together with the paper on Philosophies of Education and Educational Research".

We are at your disposal for whatever help we might give you on the subject, and await further news.

Dear Mr. de Silva:

I have discussed with several of my associates the contents of your letter dated June 3rd, that brings to our consideration the project of issuing a special number of "Educação e Ciencias Sociais" devoted to educational research, to be eventually used in the preparation of the forthcoming Conference, to be held in Japan.

We shall be very glad to cooperate with you, pending, however, on our ability to accomplish the task. As a matter of fact, the project as described seems, to our advice, to involve a number of difficulties that would have to be cleared up prior to any definitive decision regarding its execution, to be takem by UNESCO and our Centro.

It appers to us that the description of the general status of educational research in the various contries has been pretty well worked over. The issue of "Review of Education Research" of February, 1957, the issue of July - Septemberr, 56 of "Revista Brasileira de Estudos Pedagógicos"; and the University of London Yearbook of Education, 1958, all deal with the subject in such a way as to leave little room for more effort in the same line, specially if we consider the existent skepticism regarding discussion about educational ressearch, as distinguished from reporting on effectiva educational ressearch in progress or recently completed.

Accordingly, we do not feel too much inclined to push the iniciative, although we are, nevertheless, willing to cooperate with you, if your have some good ideas which we might follow on behalf of "vitalizing" the project.

One approach which might prove for the Conference in Japan would be to select six or eight countries having the same set of educational problems and invite reporters from each one to write a brief and somewhat critical account of the research under way in their respective countries and the results of it, so as to provide some factual base for discussion of the pratical usefulness of the evidence brought to light by educational research. The countries chosen might be ones in a state of rapid social change, calling for equivalent rapidly developing educational systems. Or there might be two grups of countries, one as described above and another assembling european and american countries with stabilized educational systems, but that have been undergoing a good deal of economic and social change since World War II.

One or two writers from each country might be asked to write on the list of topics previously selected by the editors. Thus, to use one topic from the suggested list in this letter, the reader could see how the several countries are dealing with the problem of retention or of promotion of children in the first grade of school, what research is being done on this problem, and what results of research are now available.

Such a procedure might help to focus the meetings at Tokyo, which appear to us to be in danger of suffering from diffuseness.

If you like this idea and can see a way of pushing it ahead, we should be glad to cooperate with a special number of our Bulletin.
