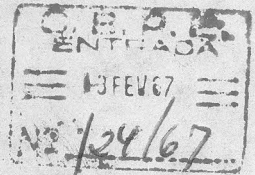

Dear Friend:

Enclosed you will find a copy of the 1967 questionnaire on research and activities in the field of intergroup relations. This questionnaire is part of the annual census jointly sponsored by the Anti-Defamation League and several learned professional societies. It is being sent, as it has been for the past nine years, to members of the societies, to colleges and universities both in the U.S.A. and abroad, and to interested persons engaged in relevant research.

We are pleased to report that Dr. Melvin Tumin of the Department of Sociology, Princeton University, has again agreed to serve as editor of the annual summary.

We are compiling a complete review of the current research in intergroup relations and would appreciate it if you would fill out the form and return it to us in the enclosed envelope. If you feel that someone else in your institution or member of your society is better qualified to answer the questions, please pass it along. Additional copies of the questionnaire are available on request.

Since our use of the term "intergroup relations" may not be adequately descriptive, let us explain that we are arbitrarily limiting our Annual to reports of research on relations between groups that are ethnic, racial, religious, or national in character. Caste and class, while not our primary emphasis, will be included where related to these factors.

In order to obtain more thorough reporting of research, we would appreciate receiving the names of individuals or research institutions in your country to whom we might send questionnaires. Can you help us make our census as complete as possible?

Enclosed for your information is a notice describing the 1965 Research Annual. Please note the categories of relevant research. The 1966 edition will be ready for distribution in late Spring. The results of the current study will be published in 1968.

"Continuing an annual enterprise begun in 1958, this bulletin is designed to provide digests of research in the field of intergroup relations for the periods September, 1964, to April, 1965 . . . The information on which the digests are based was secured from responses to questionnaires sent out to persons identified as possibly active in the field of intergroup relations."

Encompassing completed, continuing, and contemplated projects, Professor Tumin provides an authoritative, cross referenced guide to current investigations of prejudice and social and behavioral problems among ethnic, racial, religious, and national groups. Reports are categorized according to principal focus of interest and listed alphabetically by author. The RESEARCH ANNUAL makes readily available the latest findings about patterns of discrimination in northern cities - in housing, education, and job opportunities - the attitude of the "radical right" toward Negroes and Jews, the reactions of Negroes to Puerto Ricans, of Mexicans to American Indians, of Hindus to Moslems, and of Protestants, Catholics, and Jews to each other. Other studies explore the problems of interracial marriage, the responses to the civil rights movement, the new approaches to crime and delinquency, and the development of attitudes both within minority groups and within the larger community.
